Welcome to Honningsvåg and North Cape at 71° North

For over 300 years, people have travelled to North Cape to experience the northernmost point of Europe. Feel the atmosphere - remembering that all that lies in front of you is sea and ice. The far-off horizon forms a picture of the world's circumference. We all know that the earth is round, but it still feels like we're standing on the edge of the world.

POPULATION: Honningsvåg is the main centre of Nordkapp municipality which has a total of approx. 3,300 inhabitants. In the town of Honningsvåg alone, there are approx. 2,500 inhabitants.

CLIMATE: Honningsvåg and the North Cape area have a typical coastal climate with varying weather. The winters are mild, with an average temperature of -3.6 °C in the middle of winter. The dark season starts around 20 November and lasts until around 22 January. December is the darkest month of the year. You can experience the midnight sun from mid May to the end of July.

HISTORY: Honningsvåg resembles the typical landscape of villages reconstructed after the Second World War, around the 1950s. Honningsvåg church is the oldest building in the municipality and dates back to 1885.

SHOPPING: Gift shops and clothes shops, book shop, chemist, watchmakers and optician, sports shop, electronics shop and kiosk are all located on Storgata and in the harbour area in Honningsvåg town centre. There is also a post office and two banks with ATM in the centre and three food shops in the Honningsvåg area.

CITY LIFE: Restaurants; Rica Hotellet, Corner Café, Bryggerie, Tre Kokker and «Mix Mett & God» (fast food).
Nightlife: Nøden Pub, Bryggerie and Corner Café.

OTHER: Museum, cinema, swimming pool, fitness centre, downhill slopes and cross-country trails (in Nordvågen – 7 km from Honningsvåg).

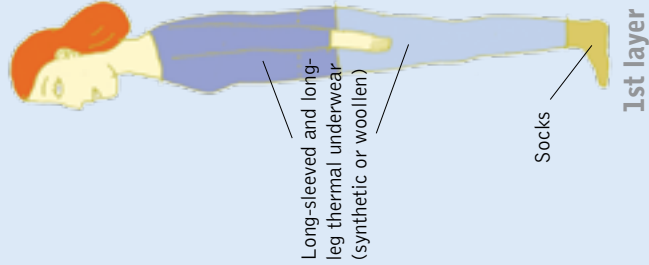

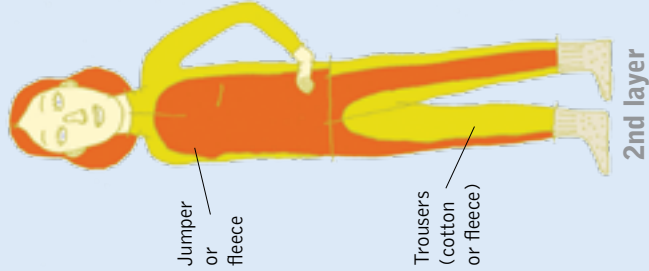

Recommended clothing

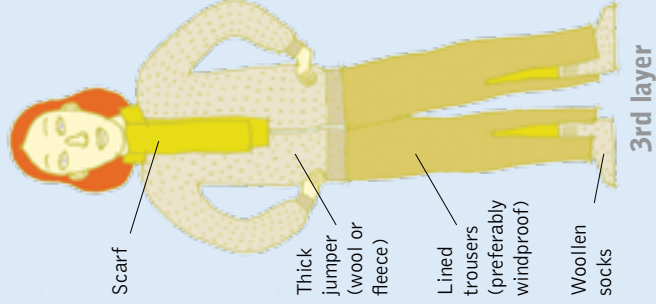

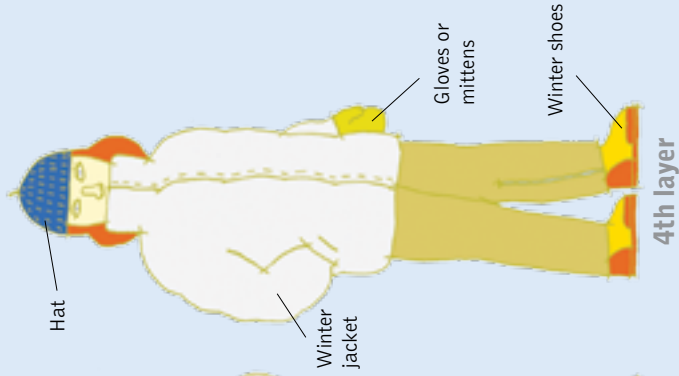
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
